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CONCERNING THE CONSIDERATION FOR STANDING OF CLERGY ORDAINED IN OTHER DENOMINATIONS

Theological Premise

- 4 Ordination to ministry is an act of the Church to sustain the witness of the faith community by persons
- 5 "set apart" for this purpose. By faith we affirm that God is the one who validates every ordination.
- 6 Therefore, it is not our task to question the ordination of minister's in other denominational traditions.
- 7 We affirm that the Commission on the Order of Ministry of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) of
- 8 Mid-America has been appointed to determine the level of fitness of individuals who apply for standing
- 9 in the ministry of our particular faith community known as the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).
- 10 In this instance, the issue being considered is STANDING, not ORDINATION. A decision to affirm or
- deny STANDING will come only after careful and prayerful consideration of the qualifications and
- motivation of the person to minister as defined by our tradition. It is not a judgment of the capacity for
- ministry as validated by other traditions. By the nature of this process, each individual will be considered
- on a "case by case" basis. Quotas and arbitrary limits will be avoided. Standards reflecting the theology
- and ecclesiology of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) will be considered the essential elements
- and will require factual evidence to create a favorable decision.

Ecclesiastical Premise

- For a clergy person to seek to move from one faith community to another is a major decision with life
- changing implications. It is more than a "career move," or a matter of personal convenience. To hold
- standing as an ordained minister of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is to incur mutual
- 21 obligations on the part of the individual minister and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Standing
- is an ecclesiastical function to affirm and support the clergy in the ministry to which she/he is called, as
- 23 well as the faith community, which calls the individual to ministry. Maintaining a balanced support for
- both the clergy and the church is the task that the General manifestation of the Christian Church
- 25 (Disciples of Christ) has entrusted to the Regional manifestation of that body. The Commission on the
- Order of Ministry (hereafter, RCOM) has accepted the responsibility to act on behalf of the Region of the
- 27 Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).
- This Commission (RCOM) shall act within the structures and procedures of our Region as well as the
- 29 "Theological Foundations and Policies and Criteria for the Ordering of Ministry of the Christian Church
- 30 (Disciples of Christ), amended 5/08/2014" as set forth through the General Assembly. Within these
- 31 limits, the Commission seeks to be both pastoral to the individual seeking standing and responsible to our
- faith community in which standing is being sought. Standards followed are developed in response to the
- 33 Gospel and to the needs of the people and congregations we represent.

Individual Premise

- Ordination and standing involve more than an individual perception of "call." H. Richard Niebuhr writes:
- 36 A call to the ministry includes at least these four elements:
- 37 1. The call to be a Christian....;



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- 2. The secret call...whereby a person feels directly summoned by God to take up the work of the ministry;
 - 3. The providential call, which...comes through the equipment of a person with the talents necessary for the exercise of the office;
 - 4. The ecclesiastical call...extended to a (person) by some community or institution of the Church to engage in the work of the ministry. ¹
- When an individual chooses to alter any one of these elements of being called to ministry, such as the
- ecclesiastical call, it is incumbent on that person to examine all the elements of a call to ministry.
- Therefore, seeking standing in a denomination other than where the individual received and expressed
- 47 [that] calling should call for rigorous self-examination. The evaluation instituted by RCOM is intended
- 48 to produce a responsible process to facilitate further growth in ministry, for both the individual and the
- 49 Church.
- Such a process requires time. It is neither wise nor appropriate for any person who is a minister in
- another denomination to expect full standing in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) immediately.
- Even if the qualifications and circumstances are such that the granting of standing is a "mere courtesy,"
- both the person and the profession benefit when the qualifications and circumstances are examined with
- care. To affirm a minimum period of one year is a measure of the seriousness with which the
- Commission takes its responsibility. Ministry requires skill, preparation, fitness, multiple gifts, and an
- evident commitment to the Christ and to the faith community that bears his name.

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- 60 Procedure and Requirements for Ministers Ordained in Another Denomination, (NOT UCC),
- 61 Seeking Ordained Minister Standing Within The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)
- 62 Summary of Procedures for Application for Standing
- 63 The following eight points outline, in brief, the procedure for applying for Standing. The full
- 64 explanation follows of Procedure, Requirements, Documentation provided to the Candidate and
- 65 required from the Candidate. Please read carefully all information which follows.
- 1. Secure material and forms needed for application (see attached list). Consult with the appropriate
- 67 Regional Minister Team member concerning clarification of materials. Obtain appropriate transcripts
- from colleges and seminaries.
- 69 2. Submit written materials and transcripts prior to an interview with the RCOM Coordinator or Regional
- 70 Minister Team member designated.
- 3. Schedule an interview with the appropriate Regional Minister Team member. Meet with that person.
- With the assistance of that person, schedule an interview with the Commission on the Order of Ministry
- so that appropriate documents may be presented and a personal interview conducted.



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- 4. Be willing to submit a summary of recent psychological tests to the RCOM Coordinator, or arrange
- with him/her for the tests to be conducted by the agency designated by the region. Submit the four
- reference letters to the Commission office. These are all to be submitted thirty days prior to the interview
- 77 with the Commission.
- 78 5. Meet with the Commission on the Order of Ministry. If a positive determination is made, the
- 79 candidate will be "brought under care" and assigned to an ordained Disciple pastor as the candidate's
- 80 Mentor.

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- 6. Participate in guided reading and learning about the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) for a period
- of six to eighteen months, usually one year if carefully scheduled. This is for the mutual growth in
- 83 relationships between the candidate and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Complete and submit
- 84 certificate of completion of a course in Disciples History and Polity.
- 7. After the study program is completed and a final report is submitted by the Mentor, meet a second time
- with RCOM for a review of the progress and consideration for standing.
- 87 **8.** If progress warrants and all reports and recommendations are positive, the Commission will grant
- 88 Standing in accordance with procedures of the "Theological Foundations and Policies and Criteria of the
- 89 Order of Ministry" and the Region of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) of Mid-America.

Additional Information to Guide Candidates in the Process toward Standing

- 91 **1.** Any minister from another denomination seeking recognition of Ordination and Standing must meet
- 92 the same standards of preparation and fitness as those who are members of the Christian Church
- 93 (Disciples of Christ) and seek Ordination and Standing through the processes of nurture and certification.
- 94 The standards for the latter process are specified in the *Theological Foundations and Policies and*
- 95 Criteria for the Ordering of the Ministry the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), [pg. 34-35] and
- 96 normally include a graduate degree from an ATS accredited theological seminary or equivalent from an
- 97 institution of higher education, endorsement from a regional Commission on the Order of Ministry, and
- 98 sponsorship by two local Disciple congregations.
- 99 2. Ordained ministers of other denominations seeking Standing with the Christian Church (Disciples of
- 100 Christ) need to, (1) read the above mentioned "Theological Foundations and Policies and Criteria...,"
- document to identify the procedures to follow, (2) schedule an interview with the Mid-America Regional
- Minister Team member responsible for such interviews. Concerning the interview, the Candidate needs
- to understand that issues of confidentiality are balanced with concerns of collegiality, and data learned in
- the process may be shared, when appropriate, with the Commission on the Order of Ministry and (3)
- complete a course In Disciples History and Polity.
- The content of the interview will include an exploration of motive, need, realistic opportunity of
- placement with a Disciples congregation, or other ministry setting, a discussion of relationships with
- judicatory officials of the present denomination, an examination of differences of theology, ecclesiology
- and methodologies in ministry, and any other questions considered appropriate by the Regional Minister
- 110 Team member conducting the interview.



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- 3. The Candidate shall submit a written statement concerning his/her understanding of ministry within
- the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). This statement should include a description of the pilgrimage
- of faith that has resulted in the request for standing in the Disciples church, the meaning of "Church," the
- meaning of "Ministry" and the role and authority of ministers. It must also reveal the candidate's
- understanding of the structure and polity of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) as well as concepts
- of ministry found in that body.
- 4. The Candidate shall present documentation of ordination as well as a Ministerial Profile, official
- transcripts from the colleges and seminaries attended, four references from clergy and laity who have
- observed the candidate's ministry, and evidence that the candidate is a minister in good standing within
- the present denomination. Contacts and references may be sought from the candidate's present
- denomination before standing is approved, so responsibility lies with the candidate to inform the
- Regional Minister Team member or the Commission on the Order of Ministry if there is a reason this
- 123 contact should not be made or should be delayed.
- 5. The Candidate must be willing to undergo a psychological evaluation. This will be with an agency
- specified by RCOM or a Regional Minister Team member. If a recent psychological evaluation is
- presented, the evaluating agency must be acceptable to RCOM. Any cost for the psychological
- evaluation will be at the expense of the Candidate. Care and respect for the confidentiality of the
- 128 Candidate will be given.
- 129 **6**. The Candidate shall be assigned to an Ordained Disciples of Christ minister in good standing who will
- serve as the Candidate's Mentor. The role of the Mentor is to offer counsel, support and guidance during
- this period of transition between denominations. The Mentor's evaluation of the candidate's progress
- shall become part of the data to determine the Candidate's qualifications and fitness for ministry in the
- 133 Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).
- 7. In a time frame of twelve to eighteen months, the candidate will follow a course of action proposed by
- the Commission, which includes but is not limited to assigned readings, interviews with established
- Disciple of Christ leaders, and participation in regional and general events such as assemblies,
- workshops, leadership labs.
- 138 8. Following self-examination, the initial interview with a Regional Minister Team member, an
- interview with RCOM, and the period of directed study (all of which are set out above), there will be a
- second interview with RCOM. The progress of the Candidate will be evaluated from the reports of the
- above. The granting of standing may be considered at this time. Standing may be granted; or if the
- 142 Commission members desire to see more progress on the part of the Candidate, Standing may be
- 143 deferred.
- 9. Completing the process for Recognition of Standing does not, in itself, assure a position in ministry
- within the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). The "call" system of the Christian Church leaves to
- 146 congregations, and other ministry units, the right to select their own minister(s) within the policies and
- criteria of the Christian Church. Although the Regional Minister Team provides consultation and
- assistance in every way possible in the process of the call, they will not presume upon the authority of the
- 149 congregation. The "call" of a congregation to a minister to become the settled pastor does not, in itself,
- assure recognition of standing. That function has been delegated to the Region, which has delegated it to



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- 151 RCOM. However, temporary Recognition of Ordination in another denomination may be granted by the
- 152 Commission for the purpose of allowing time for the minister to complete the process of obtaining
- 153 Standing in the above-described manner. Granting of a temporary Recognition of Ordination in another
- denomination will be at the discretion of RCOM.
- 155 **10**. Upon satisfactory completion of examination, positive recommendation given by the responsible
- Regional Minister Team member and affirmation by RCOM, Standing shall be granted with the
- Recognition of Ordination in another denomination. It is recommended that this be publicly recognized
- with a Certificate of Recognition given in a worship celebration, presented by a Regional Minister Team
- member or a chosen representative.
- 160 Items to be provided to the Candidate and Items to be submitted to the RCOM Coordinator and to
- 161 the Commission on the Order of Ministry for Application for Standing in The Christian Church
- 162 (Disciples of Christ)

- 4. Documentation of ordination and standing with present denomination
- 5. Official transcripts from college(s), university(ies) and seminary(ies) attended
- 6. A summary of recent psychological evaluation
- 7. A statement of the candidate's reasons for seeking standing with the Christian Church
- (Disciples of Christ) and an understanding of ministry within our denomination.
