
Friday Letter March 1, 2024

I looked again to see that she had a little one with her. He had been born long enough that his little body was dry, and he was mobile, not steady but trying very hard to keep up with Mama. I jumped off my tractor to see this beautiful baby and began waving my arms at Tim who was on his new blue tractor, to come and see! Ocho, the mother cow, had her little one on Tuesday. A

beautiful little boy. One of those early in the year blessings. His arrival happened on the day that we were 77°! Of course, that night it got down into the twenties but he's doing well. We named him Rio.

We've been watching the goats, a couple of the girls that had babies last year are definitely preparing to have little ones. But we had a real surprise this morning when we went up to the goats and one of the yearlings showed signs of birth, but we couldn't find the baby. Tim got one of his hound dogs in to see if he could find it, but we were unsuccessful. It had been a very cold night down in the '20s, but I told Tim we're not super familiar with them birthing in the wild and if they're like deer and they tell their little ones to stay put and hide them, they will stay until the mama comes back. So maybe this afternoon when we get back, we will find her with her

little one. We never dreamed she was old enough to have a baby and she showed no signs of pregnancy either. It could be she was too young, and the pregnancy was not viable, or it could have been a false pregnancy, hard to tell when so young.

I am often reminded of hope. With the little goat, hope that we might find the kid and or hope that she is healthy and able to kid in the future. She appears to be in good health now. There is always hope.
