It is with both sorrow and binding appreciation that the International Disciples Women Ministries Executive Committee received a letter of resignation from Rev. Angéle Saunders Johnson on March 5, 2024. As Executive Director, Rev. Johnson has served tirelessly for nearly three years, building healthy process structures, restoring regional connections, and leading extensive financial recovery for Disciples Women as it navigates new realities. Her work with Disciples Women has been a labor of love with lasting implications. We wish her and her beloved family well as she moves forward to her next executive call within the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). Rev. Johnson will conclude her ministry as Executive Director on March 31, 2024. Details about a virtual celebration for Rev. Johnson, to be held on March 25th, will be shared in the coming days. Our hearts are grateful for the gifts and strong leadership Rev. Johnson brought to Disciples Women.

Executive Committee called a meeting on March 7, 2024. In that meeting, the committee voted to extend a call to Rev. Dr. Debra Reid as Interim Executive Director of Disciples Women.

This decision was made to ensure no momentum is lost in the notable ways God is moving in Disciples Women.

Rev. Dr. Reid is a native Memphian. She retired from the Federal Government after 35 years of public service as a senior manager in the Human Capital Organization. She is a member of Anointed Temple of Praise Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and is active in the Tennessee Region serving on the Regional Board as Second Vice Moderator, Commission on Anti/Racism Pro-Reconciliation and Commission on Ministry. Dr. Reid is also a facilitator for Clergy Healthy Boundaries training. Dr. Reid is deeply committed to Women's Ministry, and her dedication is evident through her notable service as the



Director of Legislation, Vice President, and President of the Tennessee Disciples Women's Ministry (TDWM). Currently, she serves as the Vice President of the Disciples Women's Leadership Cabinet (DWLC), the First Vice President of the National Convocation Disciples Women, and the representative of the National Convocation Disciples Women on the IDWM Executive Committee. Additionally, she was selected as a 2023 Woman-to-Woman delegate to Japan and South Korea.

She holds a Bachelor of Science from the University of Tennessee at Martin. Dr. Reid also earned a Master of Religion, Master of Divinity, and Doctor of Ministry from Memphis Theological Seminary. She is the proud mother of two adult daughters, Courtney and Amber, and of Mac, her shorkie. We are confident Dr. Reid will bring steady, intentional, collaborative leadership to Disciples Women during this transition.

Our love, prayers, and support are with both Rev. Angéle Saunders Johnson and Rev. Dr. Debra Reid in their new beginnings.

Last week our black and white hound dog had been missing almost a week and I told my husband that we needed to put him on Facebook and see if someone has seen him. Facebook was how I found my horse years ago when he had crossed the river.

I contacted a Lost Pet site on Facebook and posted him there and they gave me some pointers. I put him on my homepage and then made it shareable (that was a deal, I'm not real savvy). We made posters and took them to the vet's offices and put it on available bulletin boards around town. After about 24 hours we heard from an individual that had seen him. Apparently, the neighbors had him and he was confined, okay and taken care of, but in a fenced area and on a chain. He had never been accustomed to that. He's a dog that watches after our cattle, our goats, our chickens, our cats, and his fellow canines. We were so incredibly thrilled when we got the message, he was okay, and my husband was guided to him. Tim said he was so happy when he heard his voice and couldn't get enough of him on the way home!

The other animals now are very happy to have him home. He sits out in the field with the cattle and watches them. The cats are feeling freer to wander around. His buddy the other black and white mix that we

have is very happy to have his friend back. My husband has a bigger smile on his face when he goes out in the morning.

Life never stays the same, we all know that. We all have transitions and new chapters in our lives but it's nice when chapters find a way to be continued and transitions are not as soon as they could be.

Using this form of social media, Facebook, to find him was a blessing. Had we not put that on Facebook, made the flyers, contacted the vet's offices etc. I don't know if we would have ever seen him again. Not that he was not cared for, not that he would not have had a good life, but his life would not have been on the farm with those who already love him and need him.

A community, we all need a community and I pray that we each have a community in our churches, our church families. Reach out to those that don't have a church family, who don't know the value and the joy that comes from a community of believers. You never know what has kept someone from church. You never know if they have been fenced in or chained up to something that has kept them from reaching out and leaving the shackles of life.
